Time-to-Degree

AMC: Attrition rates and time to graduation *averaged over the past 5 years* are:

4-year-to-degree graduation rate = 85.0%

Overall graduation rate = 94.1%

National: Attrition and time to graduation reported in the AAMC Data Snapshot October 2025, which included only students in MD-only programs, are:

4-Year graduation rates ranging from 80.0% to 84.1%.

Overall graduation rates 6 years after matriculation were 96.1% for students in MD-only programs.

The AAMC Resident Readiness Survey provides feedback to medical schools about the performance of their graduates. Early in postgraduate year one (internship), residency program directors are invited to respond to the survey. For the class of 2024 the response rate was 75.4%
